All students who are enrolled the Master’s Degree Program are requested to follow the current curriculum. The elective courses will be offered depending on faculty and students’ petitions. One acup. elective course is required for all MSOM students.

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• 360 TCM Terminology and 365 Five Elements are required courses for students who enrolled in the program before 1/1/2005, but electives for students enrolled after 1/1/2005. Classes marked “New” are not required for students who enrolled before 1/1/2005.

• 503N Jing Gui Yao Lue, 552N Dui Yao, 588 Chinese Herbal Review, and 687 Medical Billing are required courses for the students who enrolled in the program after 1/1/2005; but electives for the students enrolled before 1/1/2005. 360 Chinese Medical Terminology and 365N Five Elements are required for those enrolled in the program before 1/1/2005, but electives for those enrolled after 1/1/2005.

• 361 Fundamental Theories I was Fundamental Theories of Chinese Medicine. 363R Fundamental Theories II was Zangfu syndromes I.

• Students will be eligible to begin internship once they have completed 361, 363R, 364N, 366N: Fund I & II, Ch. Med. Diagnosis, and Zangfu II, plus all acupuncture courses except 541 Tuina; 330, 331, 332, 333, 334: Intro to Herb and Herb I-IV; 220, 310, 311, 312, 313; WMT, Topo. Anatomy, and A&P I-III;

601, 602, 605, 606, 607: Observations; and CPR & TOFLE. Everyone must pass the Pre-Clinic Written and Practical Point Location Exams.
